## Adult Guidance with Question Prompts

Children use the language of comparison to compare groups of objects. Children will use 'equal to', 'more than', 'less than', 'fewer', 'most' and 'least'.

Look at the bananas. How many are in the first bunch?

How many are in the second bunch?

What does 'most' mean?

Which bunch has more than the other?

What does 'fewer' mean?

Look at the plates of grapes. Can you tell which has fewer without counting? Explain how you know.

How many blueberries are in each of these groups?

Can you explain what 'equal' means?

Which two groups are equal?

How many oranges are in the middle box?

Can you point to the word that says 'less'?

What do you think the other word says?

Can you draw oranges to correctly complete the table?

Has your friend drawn the same?

Are there different possible answers?

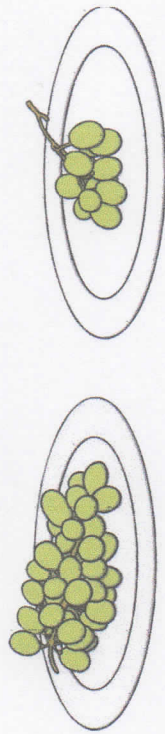
## Comparing Groups



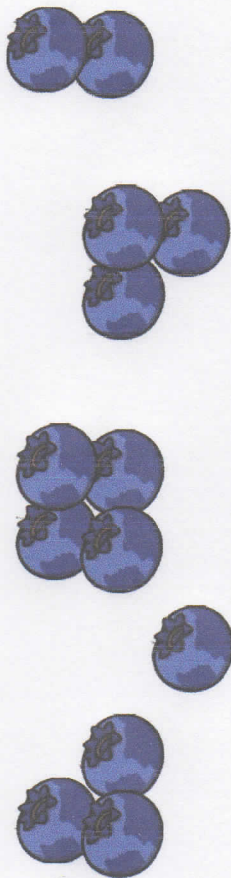
Circle the bunch with the most bananas.




Circle the plate with fewer grapes.
